We've come a long way since the pandemic was declared over 2 years ago. Two years without an Easter service of JOY and celebrating. The good news is that the wait is over. We can celebrate Easter with

I can't wait to break my Lenten fast of water (my only beverage) and to enjoy a cup of coffee. I can't wait to shout out "Alleluia!" This is the word that we put away during Lent. The children hide our 'Alleluia' banner in the church, and then find it on Easter Sunday. I can't wait to share the good news of our salvation.

All of our Easter hymns are filled with the hope and the reality of the resurrection of Christ. Each hymn is in the present as our living God, the risen Christ, is here with us today. We don't sing, "Jesus Christ WAS risen 2000 years ago." Instead we sing, "Jesus Christ IS risen today." This is a present and not a past reality. We don't sing, "love's redeeming work WAS done." Instead we sing, "love's redeeming work IS done." Yes, Jesus was crucified a long time ago, but you and I share today in the glory and in the wonder of his resurrection. The angels are singing today and so are we!

The power and the light of the risen Christ transcends time and space and brings us to new life today! The day of resurrection is ours for today. Death has been defeated and we have the promise of eternal life. That eternal life begins as soon as we bring the power of God into our lives and into our hearts. There is no more meaningful way to live. I could not do any of my ministry if I did not receive all my strength from the living God.

There is power in the present. Our journey as Christians is not a journey about the past but a journey about today, with our eyes focused forward. We still remember and learn from the legacy of the past but we know that our faith is a living faith and we are brought to newness today.

One of the many things that I cherish about St. Paul's is your ability to walk in newness of life. St. Paul said it best "Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life." (Romans 6:4) We are blessed with children and young people in this parish who have a thirst to know God. We have 9 children participating in 'Life In The Eucharist' (First Communion classes) and many children have returned to our Sunday morning service. We made a commitment to young families years ago, and my prayer is that every single person feels truly welcome when they worship with us.




# '<u>Drive-By' Blessing! PALM SUNDAY</u> April 10, 2:00-3:00 pm

#### Join Our 'Mini-Camino' Walks

We are planning 8 weekly walks around Boulevard Lake, Mondays evenings at 7 pm. We will meet in the main parking lot and from there walk the 5 km around the Lake. There will also be shorter walks. We encourage each walker to raise \$100 over the 8 walks. The money will be given directly on-line to the Anglican Foundation and the proceeds used for 5 bursaries for 5 graduating Dennis Franklin Cromarty High School students. The 5 recipients need to be heading to college or university.
